




Canteen Mural Project



In 2016 leading up to Burrendah Primary School's 40th celebrations parents and community members expressed their desire to see our existing canteen given a well-overdue makeover.

The original artwork was part of a project completed with students in the early 1980's and it was felt we as a school were moving into recognising a more connected vision through our school namesake 'the home of the place of the nesting swan' we could make visual links with the traditional story. Artist Darren Hutchins worked closely with Art Specialist Teacher Danielle Eitzen to bring to life images of flora and fauna within the local environment whilst also representing the role of our school canteen in promoting healthy food choices for our students.

Ms Eitzen has incorporated student learning and understandings of 'this place' Burrendah across the curriculum for students in HASS; History & Geography through the Visual Arts program. The completed artwork welcomes our students, parents and community into our school hub where we have whole school gatherings, performances and celebrations. This project was endorsed and supported by our passionate P&C members in addition to our School Board. P&C contributed the funds to commission the Artist to plan and complete the artwork.



Morning Tea/Lunches

Parents are reminded that with the later lunch time of 1:05pm, it is imperative that children are given a substantial morning tea to see them through till 1:05pm when they will eat lunch. Please ensure your child has a morning tea and it is sufficient to sustain them to 1:05pm. Children cannot concentrate on their learning if they are hungry.

The school endorses the Department's Healthy Eating Policy and we ask parents to ensure the morning tea you provide is healthy and has a minimal amount of processed packaged foods. These commercially packed foods generally offer limited nutritional value, are difficult for children to open and create excess litter around the school. Parents are encouraged to include fruit and vegetables in their children's lunch boxes. Lollies and chocolates are not appropriate for school lunch boxes, and no nuts or nut pastes are to be included in school lunch boxes due to some of our students having life threatening allergies.

Each classroom adopts a form of the "crunch and sip" program to ensure students have a healthy fruit and vegetable snack at some time in the school day. If parents need to bring their child's lunch to school, please go to the front office and the child will be asked to collect it from there.

It would be great to see as many parents attend as possible, to support this event.


