

Student Code of Internet Conduct Guidelines for Parents



Dear Parent/ Guardian

The Internet is an exciting and powerful tool for students to research information for both academic assignments as well as their own personal interests. In addition to this, students have the opportunity to collaborate and communicate with their peers across and beyond the school.

As part of our curriculum, pupils have controlled access to the Internet and learn how to use libraries, databases and information sources on a wide variety of topics. We recognise that some inappropriate material on the Internet may be accessed intentionally or by accident, even though the school has Internet filtering in place. We teach students the importance of responsible use of the web and E-mail as well as providing basic rules to maintain the privacy of students. At all times, pupils must agree to follow the **Student Code of Internet Conduct** attached to this letter.

To enable your son/daughter permission to use and contribute to the Internet please read and discuss the **Student Code of Internet Conduct** and return the attached form to the class teacher. The Internet will be freely available to all students during normal teaching activities and during other supervised activities.

Our school reserves the right to amend the basic rules, **Student Code of Internet Conduct** and guidelines as required. Any modification to the Code of Conduct will be publicised in the school's newsletters.

The **Student Code of Internet Conduct** attached applies at all times, in and out of school hours, whilst using school equipment. Students need to be aware that inappropriate use can be tracked at any given time.

Internet and E-mail access will be provided to students if they have returned the signed (parent and student) **Student Code of Internet Conduct** agreement form.

This policy is intended as a general outline of our school's approach. It is not intended to be an authoritative guide to every aspect of Learning Technology usage. This document will be supplemented by procedural guidelines as required.
